WHY MIGRANT PARENT ENGAGEMENT?



GENERAL BACKGROUND:

Every 2nd child in Hamburg has migrant roots.

Educational success of children depends on socio-economic background of parents.

Parent involvement is part of the Provincial Education Act.

Parent involvement formats address rather native-born middle & upper class populations.

FACTS ON PARENTING:

Parents are co-educators number 1.

Parents play the most important role in the career planning of their children.

Due to parent involvement during the period of signing the training contracts

HypoVereinsBank reduced the annual number of contract returns from over 100 to under 10 in Germany.

An average mother spends 4 minutes a day for checking her child's homework.

Migrant parents have a strong educational aspiration but a poor knowledge of the system of education

- more encounters between parents and institutions**




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


